VISION EDINA WAS THE RESULT OF A BROAD-BASED AND INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY VISIONING PROCESS CONDUCTED IN 2014-2015.

It is a long-term strategic framework that lays out the key issues identified by the Edina community. Vision Edina established the stakeholders' desire to pursue a preferred future of "Nodes and Modes." Nodes and Modes is an effort to maintain and enhance the characteristics and fabric of the Edina community yet embrace balanced urban renewal. The central part of this preferred future is the focus on unique nodes that represent the character and future goals of each neighborhood with highly connected modes of transportation between them.

In preparation of the City of Edina's 2018 Comprehensive Plan Update, Future iQ facilitated a community workshop on April 19 aimed at encouraging new "big ideas" and connecting those ideas to the eight key strategic focus areas that emerged from Vision Edina with an ultimate goal of finding ideas that propel Edina towards its Nodes and Modes preferred future.

The eight strategic focus areas are:

- Residential Development Mix
- Transportation Options
- Commercial Development Mix
- Live and Work
- Educational Focus
- Population Mix
- Environmental Stewardship
- Regional Leadership


The workshop participants were asked to rank which major strategic focus areas should be a priority for innovation in Edina over the next 5 years.

The participants ranked Environmental Stewardship (25%)

and Transportation Options (25%) as the top two innovation priority areas, followed by Education Focus (18%), Commercial Development Mix (11%), Residential Development Mix (9%), Regional Leadership (6%), Population Mix (4%), and Live and Work (1%).

The following nine pages consist of the big ideas participants came up with for each of the eight strategic focus areas and a big picture "Nodes and Modes" framework. The ideas highlighted were the 'top big ideas' presented by each group.

BIG IDEAS



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NODES AND MODES

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BIG IDEAS

Create a model neighborhood in Edina as an example of where our vision is going – mixed housing, sustainable development, more biking and walking (Environmental Stewardship, Transportation, Residential Development).

Learning spaces within each node – entrepreneur idea center, higher education, YMCA, etc.

That education should be integrated into key values/ideas/design

Transportation: Connect the various trails into a connected trail system. Benefits:

- Environmental (decrease car use)
- Social; attract younger people
- Health (improve, reduce costs)
- Beautification of the city

Promote node diversity with incentivizing of variable economic access.

Grandview as a transportation node with parking, connection to regional transit, city-wide trolley system. This can also be a place for an arts center, housing, travel training – high school students for health class learn how to take transit, then track others (elders, immigrants – ELL) how to use.

Intra-Quadrant Trail System

The "Nodes and Modes" focus should be a priority of all redevelopment/repur pose – eg. community – learning gardens/Cahill gardens

Much more extensive food and bike path system with cleverly integrated education; concrete with learning literally written into it.

Current trends in residential development (larger houses that leave less land and use more energy and water) are directly contradictory to goals of environmental stewardship.

Stricter building standards that mandate education as part of it.


